**When God moves it is by a supernatural miracle.** A simple definition of a miracle is, “an extra-ordinary event that is not caused or explained by natural or scientific laws...”

Read the brochure, “Christmas, The Original Story,” which tells of the events during this miraculous, supernatural time in history!

- The first miracle of the story** is that, in spite of impossible odds, God brought His Son into our world just as He had prophesied throughout the Old Testament. His Word ALWAYS comes to pass, no matter what the odds or how long it takes. Here are only 3 out of 400...
  - The first promise of the Messiah born of a woman. (Genesis 3:15)
  - The Messiah would be born in Bethlehem. (Micah 5:2)
  - The Messiah would be born of a virgin. (Isaiah 7:14)
- The second miracle** is that God uses ordinary people of faith to be extra-ordinary vessels for His glory!
  - Zechariah, a priest in Israel, needed proof and assurance that God would do what He said. (Luke 1:18-20)
  - Mary simply replied with, “Let it be done to me according to Your Word.” (Luke 1:38)
- The third miracle** is that God can use a normal, worldly stage, no matter how terrible, to create a Heavenly scene. God simply caused the mighty Roman Government to be a tool in His Hand to bring Mary and Joseph from Nazareth to Bethlehem and perfectly fulfill His Word. (Luke 2:1-7)
